Student Transportation

Middle School (6th-8th grade)

- Eligibility criteria for yellow school buses for middle school students is as follows: *middle school student's registered home address is 1.0 mile or more from the school location.*
- This means: if you live less than 1 mile from our new location, your child will not be eligible for a yellow school bus.

High School (9th - 12th grade)

- High school students are not eligible for yellow school buses.
- High school students would receive a GBTA public city bus pass if they meet the following criteria: <u>high school</u> <u>student's registered home address</u> is 2 miles or more from the school <u>location.</u>
- This means: if you live less than 2 miles from our new location, your child will not be eligible for a GBTA bus pass.

Middle School Program

Academic Approach

- We offer ELA, Math, Science, and Social Studies.
- Students receive 90 minute blocks of ELA and Math instruction.
- Our specials include P.E., Art/Creative Writing, and Enrichment.
- We have embedded AmeriCorps
 Fellows into core content classrooms to provide the opportunity for small group support.
- Students receive support for individual needs in reading, math, and writing through our Exact Path and Flex classes.

Whole Child Approach

- Students engage in Social-Emotional Learning through advisory and after school program offerings such as Sawubona.
- We promote positive behavior through monthly events and trips.
- We participate in the CT Invention Convention - Develops & enhances problem solving, critical thinking skills.
- 8th grade students have an anticipated formal and graduation.
